GENERAL RULES

1. ALL Junior Riders may not ride anywhere on the show grounds with out wearing protective headgear passing ASTM/SEI certification. Harnesses on helmets must be secured. Any Junior riders found violating this rule at any time will be prohibited from further riding until the proper protective headgear is put into place.
2. Any Adults jumping anywhere on the show grounds, riding in any hunter class and/or division must be wearing approved ASTM headgear (as stated above). Any rider violating this rule at any time will be immediately prohibited from riding until proper headgear is in place.
3. Adults are encouraged to comply with the above rule concerning protective headgear.
4. No drugs or alcohol shall be allowed on the SHSA show grounds.
5. All dogs must be on leashes.
6. Stallions are only permitted in the All-Breed conformation classes with an adult handler.
7. The decision of the judge is final!

ALL HORSES/PONIES MUST HAVE
CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST WITHIN
THE LAST 12 MONTHS AND IT MUST BE PRESENTED
UPON ENTRY TO SHOW GROUNDS.

Class Specifications

Class 1 & 2: Judged closest to the standard of which that breed represents, maintaining a correct conformation.

Class 3: Judged on conformation, way of going, soundness and suitability to be a hunter. Shown in a simple jointed snaffle & bridle.

Class 4: All first and second place horses from classes 1-3. Judged closest to the standard of which that breed represents, maintaining a correct conformation.

Class 5: To be judged on the handler. Conformation not judged.

Class 7-8-9: Open to riders in their 1st year of showing over fences. Riders may trot or canter over 4 simple fences no more than 18" in height. Flat class is walk/trot only.

Class 10-11-12: Open to riders in their second year of showing over fences. Only the rider to be judged. Fence height 2'.

Class 13-14-15: Open to ponies 14.2 hands and under. Fence heights - 2' or 2'6".

Class 16-17-18: Open to riders 17 and under. Fence heights - 2' or 2'6".

Class 19-20-21: Open to adult amateur riders. Fence heights - 2' or 2'6".

Class 22-23-24: Horse/rider of any age not restricted by previous showing. Fence heights 2' or 2'6".

Class 25-26-27: Open to horses and ponies in their first year of showing over fences. May compete over a simplified course (8 outside fences) or a regular hunter course. May trot or canter. Fence heights - 18" or 2'.

Class 28-29-30: Riders age 9 and under who have not won a year-end award in this division. Walk/trot (jog) only. May cross-enter into Beg. Pleasure and Beg. Equitation O/F only.

Class 31-32-33: Riders 10 years of age and older in 1 or 2nd year of showing and have not won a year-end award for this division. Equitation tests asked at the discretion of the judge. May cross-enter into Beginner Pleasure and Beginner Equitation over Fences only.

Class 34-35-36: Horses or ponies ridden in proper Hunter tack and attire. Judged at a walk/trot/canter. Class 32 is GAYP.

Class 37: Horses of any age that have not competed in a dressage test above 1st level as of January 1st of the year showing. Judged at walk/trot/canter. Snaffle bits only, jointed and unjointed. Tests may be asked at the discretion of the judge.

Class 38-39-40: Riders in 1st or 2nd year of showing, or who are eligible to show in Maiden Walk/Trot or W/T Equitation. Walk/trot(jog) only. May cross-enter into Maiden W/T, W/T Eq, and Beginner Eq. O/F.

Class 41: Open to riders 18 years and older. To be judged at a walk/trot(jog)/canter(lope). Eq. tests may be asked by the judge.

Class 42: Riders in 1st year of showing at the canter. Equitation tests may be asked at the discretion of the judge.

Class 43: Open to riders 17 years and under. Rider to be judged at the walk/trot(jog)/canter(lope). Equitation tests may be asked at the discretion of the judge.

Class 44-45-46: Open to all non-trotting breeds and non-trotting grade horses/ponies. 1st and 3rd classes to be judged at the walk/pleasure gait. Middle class is Go-At-Your-Pleasure. **This class is an understudy for the 2009 show season.**

Class 47-48-49: Open to all riders. Judged at walk/jog/lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint. Horses 5 years and under may be shown in a bosal or ring snaffle with 2 hands. Class 48 is GAYP.

Class 50-51-52: Open to all riders over 30 and all disciplines. Judged at walk/trot(jog). Judged against the standard for the discipline exhibited.

Class 53-54-55: Open to all riders in their first year of showing at a canter. Open to all disciplines. To be performed and judged the same as JUNIOR PLEASURE. Class 54 will be GAYP.

Class 56-57-58: Open to all riders 17 years and under. Judged at the walk/trot(jog)/canter(lope). Class 57 is GAYP.

Class 59-60-61: Horses/Ponies in their 1st or 2nd year of showing. Judged at a walk/trot(jog), with a mandatory canter(lope) in class 60.

Class 62-63-64: Open to all riders and all disciplines. To be judged at the walk/trot(jog) only. To be judged against the standard of the discipline exhibited.

Class 65-66-67: Open to all riders and all disciplines. To be performed at a walk/trot (jog)/canter (lope), both directions of the ring. To be judged against the standard set for the discipline of riding exhibited. Class 66 is GAYP
